# Congregational President's Report

Over the last two years, we have gone through an exciting and at times challenging period of growth as a congregation. Until August 1, 2018, we had no full-time pastor to shepherd us. But the Lord God was with us and directed our steps every bit of the way (Psalm 37:23, Proverbs 20:24), since He has promised to never leave us nor forsake us (Deuteronomy 31:6), and that He will provide for all of our needs (Philippians 4:19). He has always been faithful to us and we give Him praise for all that He has done and continues to do for each of us individually, for us corporately, and for our communities through us.



### Spiritual Leadership

God faithfully provided us with spiritual leadership for every Sunday morning worship service. Our regular visiting pastors were Pastor Arden Walz, Pastor Ron Leder, Pastor David Chamberlain, and Pastor James Rehley who graciously accepted the position of Interim Pastor for our congregation while also serving as the Circuit Visitor in 2017 until his promotion to heaven in February 2018. We were so blessed by their faithfulness to their calling and by their continued ministry to us. Their continued presence and willingness to be available to lead our congregation as Vacancy Pastors provided our little congregation with much-needed continuity during this time of transition.

It saddens us on the one hand, that Pastor Leder, Pastor Chamberlain, and Pastor Rehley are no longer with us here on earth but we do not mourn as those who have no hope (1 Thessalonians 4:13) but rather we anticipate seeing them again when we ourselves are promoted to heaven, and we rejoice!



During the Lenten and Advent Midweek Services, Pastor Rehley and later the next Circuit Visitor, Pastor Jeremy Lucke, sent us the appropriate Worship Service outlines, and included sermons that read by one of the men of our church family. During Holy Week of 2018 we were blessed to welcome back our previous pastor, Pastor David Chamberlain who conducted the Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Worship Service. We have definitely been blessed with beautiful spiritual leadership throughout this time by these wonderful under-shepherds, and we never had to cancel a service because God always made sure that there would be a pastor. On a couple of occasions last year, we were blessed to be led in worship by Deacon Jim Frickman as well.

### Call Committee

Upon finding ourselves without an incumbent pastor beginning November 1, 2016, we as a church



immediately formed a Call Committee, and began to prayerfully search for the pastor that we thought God would want us to have. Pastor Rehley was highly instrumental in getting us on the right track in all of this by helping us to wade through the morass of denominational, technical, and financial requirements. Finally, in the Spring of 2018, we were blessed when Pastor John A. Westhafer accepted the call to be our new under-shepherd. We could not be more blessed to have him leading us spiritually, and to welcome his very sweet wife, Carol. He officially started leading us as our Pastor on August 1, 2018. Hallelujah!

Throughout this time, our members have looked out for one another, taken care of one another, been faithful in both their giving and their attendance, and have come together as a church family in good times, in bad times, on Sundays and on other occasions for various activities.





# BUILDING TRUSTEE REPORT BY JOHN HAINES

The last two years have been exciting here at OSLC! We were able to complete many projects to keep our building and grounds safe and clean, as well as to improve the property!

### Projects to date include:

- The sign at the entry of the property has been rebuilt. It had fallen apart. We used new, pressure-treated lumber to build a new sign. All that might still be needed is new plexiglass.
- Our plan is to eventually transition all light fixtures in the building to LED lighting to reduce our electricity costs. At this point, it is also a matter of waiting for the costs of LED lighting to come down some more before we purchase more. For now, we replaced the lighting on the sides of the sanctuary and on the Cross with LED lights.
- The exterior light fixtures at the entry to the church have been repaired and the fixtures replaced, too.



- The mixer board that is used in our church sound system was repaired. This allows the members of the congregation to hear the pastor through a microphone, allows the choir can be heard, and makes it possible for people in the Sunday School Room to also hear the service.
- Our flooring had seen so much use over the years (hallelujah!) that the congregation voted to replace all flooring. The members of the congregation voted for the current <u>burgundy carpet</u> from a variety of carpet swatches and we hired a local company, based in Waldport, to install not only the new carpet but also the <u>vinyl</u> <u>flooring</u> for the kitchen and restrooms. The color and the pattern of the vinyl flooring was chosen so dirt and spills will not show as much.
- The glass side door to the church on the east side of the building had to be repaired because the bottom hinge broke. The other glass doors were also checked. The Newport-based glass company lubricated the other doors.
- The kitchen sink drain got clogged. After trying to fix the problem in-house, we hired a Newport-based plumber with a longer "snake" to come in and fix the problem.
- The parking lot was re-striped.
- The paint in the sanctuary was touched up.
- We bought a quality artificial Christmas tree that is hypoallergenic to not upset the congregants' allergies.
- All other aspects of the continual upkeep required to maintain the building and parts of the outside of the property were done.



- 13. Shrubbery around immediate confines of church need to be kept and sprayed, pruned, and replaced if necessary.









- Organizing an Annual Nativity Scenes Display as a means of outreach to the community.



Both Scott Clevenger and Gary Schuetze were wonderful **cantors**. They are both missed after moving out of the area.






Every Sunday after the Worship Service, we would come together to enjoy a cup of coffee or tea and some cookies, cupcakes and other pastries that were generously donated by our members.
